<u>Program Description</u>: Girls Inc. seeks a Build IT! Coordinator for the All STARS (Sports, Technology, Academics, Responsibility, and Sisterhood) Program. Specifically, this coordinator is responsible for overseeing the successful delivery of a Build IT!. Build IT! is a problem-based curriculum, which capitalizes on girls' interest in design and communication technologies through the design of blogs, websites, games, etc. The curriculum is developed through a collaboration between Girls Inc. of Alameda County and Stanford Research Institute (SRI) International.

Primary Responsibilities:

- o Collaborate with SRI to review, edit, and enhance Build IT! curriculum to assure Girls Inc. approach programming.
- o Plan and implement trainings for Build IT! staff
- o Co-facilitate direct service and provide ongoing curriculum review and adaptation meetings to assist and support program staff in the successful delivery of Build IT!.
- Assist outside evaluator and SRI in evaluation of Build IT!, including administering, collecting, and reviewing evaluation tools.
- o Work collaboratively with Program Staff to coordinate and host Family Tech Nights.
- o Coordinate and cultivate relationships with local IT professionals to serve as guest speakers and mentors to Build IT! participants.
- o Plan, oversee, and attend fieldtrips to IT related businesses, community organizations, museums, etc.
- o Enhance integration of math activities into Build IT! curriculum.

o Develop plan to integrate Build IT in to other Girls Inc. programs, as well as a plan to expand to new school sites.

Qualifications and Skills:

- Experience working with middle school aged students in after school programming, youth development or educational settings.
- Experience working with youth representing diverse cultures, ethnicities, languages, and abilities.
- Experience or interest in designing and developing project-based technology programming with youth.
- Knowledge of gender equity issues affecting girls and young women.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Bachelor's degree preferred.
